

ENGINEER MIKE FLEMING SAFETY ISSUES

Safety issues keep cropping up as motorhomes age. I recommend a periodic safety inspection for the chassis. Annual would be good, bi-annual would be acceptable, but I wouldn't recommend going longer than 3 years. Recently one Alpiner had his attention called to a battery cable that was rubbing on the frame, and it would have eventually rubbed through. Nobody needs a fire.

I'd suggest having someone who knows what they are looking at check the following, ***bold italics*** indicates serious safety issues, the rest are serious on-the-road inconvenience Preventative Maintenance suggestions:

- ◆ All battery cables for tightness at connection, excessive corrosion (not so much a safety problem as operational, but you are there anyway), and ***chaffing***.
- ◆ All hydraulic hoses (lose pressure and you lose steering and engine cooling) for leaks, ***chaffing***, and for ***drooping*** where a piece of recap could tear them out.
- ◆ Chassis lube, and ***brake rotor check***
- ◆ HWH main electrical cable routings for chaffing, tightness, corrosion, and hose routes for signs of bubbled hose, fitting leaks, etc.
- ◆ ***Tire age*** (recommend 5 years max for fronts in all cases, 6 years max for rears; if you don't like those recommendations, check around and you'll eventually find one that resonates, but front blow-outs are nasty business for you and anyone near you when your tire blows).
- ◆ Known chassis issues for affected years if not previously determined & corrected:
 - 05 rear axle hanger bolts (5/8 vs 3/4 for the later axle suspension design)
 - 06-09 "cunifer" brake line support
 - 04-09 steering gear bracket upgrade
 - 97 to 99-ish Pin-Slide Brake regular lubrication of pin slides
 - All Years- ***change*** brake fluid every 2 years
- ◆ **3-5 Year Inspection Recommendations** (after all, even coaches are get older every year)
- ◆ ***120V connections*** at generator, gen splice at front, transfer switch, inverter, water heater, electrical panels
- ◆ ***Diesel & propane connections***- tighten & visual or soap-solution inspection for leaks

By the way, for those interested in improving service brake performance, check out the iRV2.com discussion on the Alpine Owner's Forum on Meritor Braking Improvement. An interesting idea brewing there. Or check out the upcoming Alpine SoCal newsletter write-up from the Gearhead session at the Lake Tahoe Rally.

QUARTZSITE DRRXI JANUARY 19th—24th 2012


